- □ Log in to the Application Status page, using the credentials you created for the application
 - Accept your decision offer
 - Submit your DEPOSIT
 - Ensure your APPLICATION CHECKLIST ITEMS are complete
 - Follow the instructions to activate your STUDENT PORTAL ACCOUNT
 - Download and/or set up your Duo Mobile authentication. You will need this in class to access Canvas. We recommend downloading the app to your phone.
 - o FINANCIAL AID (including State and Federal Grants and Scholarships)
 - Complete your FAFSA (VTSU is 003698)
 - Complete your VSAC application
 - Complete your TRIO application
 - Complete and return your HEALTH FORM (located under Accepted Students)
 - Submit all 4 pages to the college under the application checklist
 - Submit al 4 pages to the program via CastleBranch
 - Keep a copy for your records
 - Submit a passport quality photo for your STUDENT ID CARD
 - O Register your vehicle for a PARKING PERMIT
 - Complete your REGISTRATION QUESTIONAIRE
 - O Complete VERMONT STATE 101 online orientation

☐ Laptop computer

- O Incoming paramedic students must have a personal laptop with privacy screen in class. See the IT information at www.vermontstate.edu/next-steps for specifications.
 - Our program requires you to have a laptop computer that is <u>NOT a Chromebook</u>, <u>older MacBook</u>, <u>or a tablet/iPad</u>. These are not compatible with our testing software.
 - It must also have <u>a webcam and a microphone</u>.
- O Bring your laptop to class with you every week.

□ Uniforms

- O All items can be purchased through Green Mountain Embroidery in Colchester, VT.
 - Email <u>info@greenmountainembroidery.com</u>
 - You will need a student POLO SHIRT for clinical and field rotations
 - You may wear the polo or a T-SHIRT to class/lab on Thursdays
 - You may choose to purchase other items like a Job Shirt, Hat, Vest, etc.
- o For lab, clinical, and field time your uniform also includes:
 - EMS pants, shoes/boots, trauma shears, stethoscope, pen light, pen, paper

☐ Textbooks and required computer programs

- CastleBranch is a student clinical clearance data warehouse. Start the process of clearance early.
 - Visit https://discover.castlebranch.com/ and Select PLACE ORDER, the Package ID is:
 VE59
 - Complete all required steps and upload all required information
 - Books are sold as a package through the bookstore https://vermontstate.ecampus.com/
 - The fall package includes your full FISDAP access for the entire program.
 - If you obtain the books from another source, you will be required to purchase the WHOLE SHEBANG FISDAP access though Jones and Bartlett if it does not come with your book.
