

## Certificate of Finances and Financial Documentation

All international applicants who wish to enroll as F-1 students must submit statements certifying adequate financial resources. This form must be accompanied by certification that sufficient funds will be available to meet your living and studying expenses while attending Vermont State University. Without the required documents you will not receive a SEVIS I-20 that you need to apply for your F-1 student visa.

The certificate of finances and financial documentation consists of two parts:

- 1. **Certificate of Finances Form:** Please fill out this form completely and accurately. It provides important information about your financial capability to study at Vermont State University.
- 2. **Bank Statement:** You must provide a bank statement that is dated within the past six months and shows your ability to pay for your studies at Vermont State University.

Acceptable forms of certification include, but are not limited to, the following:

- An **original** current personal bank statement.
- An **original** bank statement from your parents/guardians.
- An **original** bank statement from your sponsor.
- An **original** bank statement from other sponsoring agencies guaranteeing financial support.
- An original letter guaranteeing certified government financial aid.

NOTE ALL BANK STATEMENTS AND LETTERS MUST BE DATED WITHIN SIX MONTHS OF ACCEPTANCE
